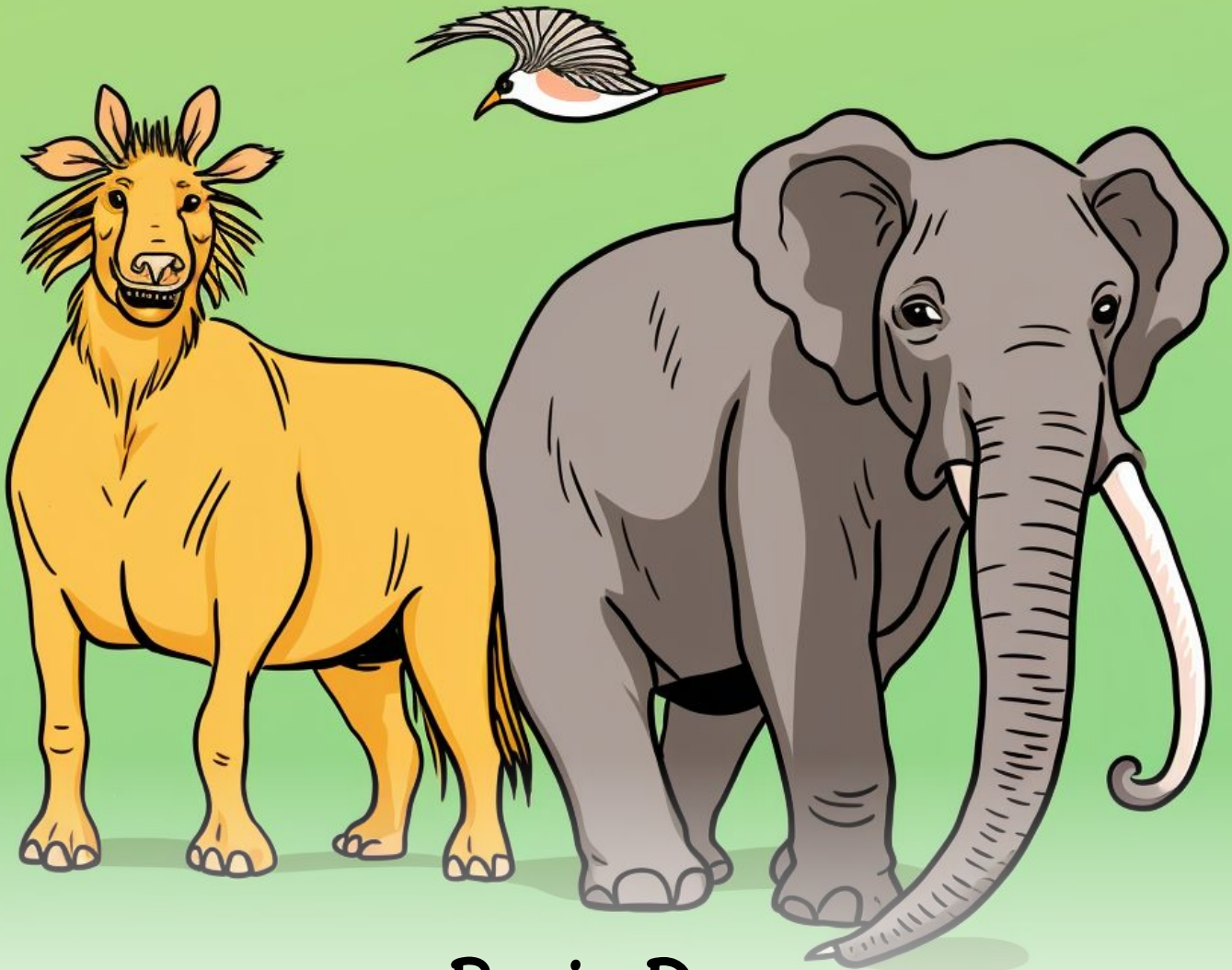

Armadillos are like nature's little knights, with bumpy armor that keeps them safe.

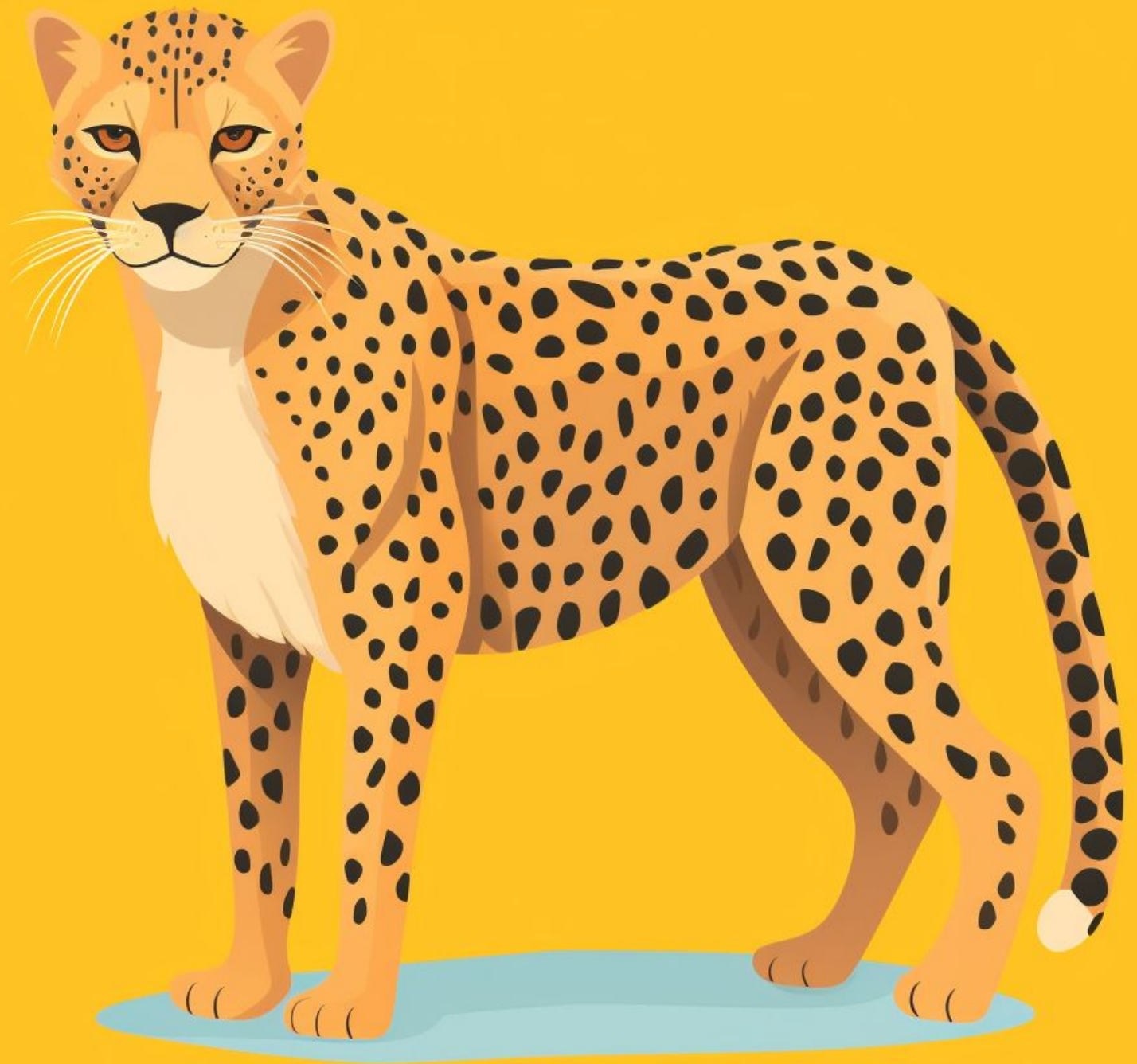


Bb

Bald eagles are like the superheroes of the sky, soaring high with their white heads.

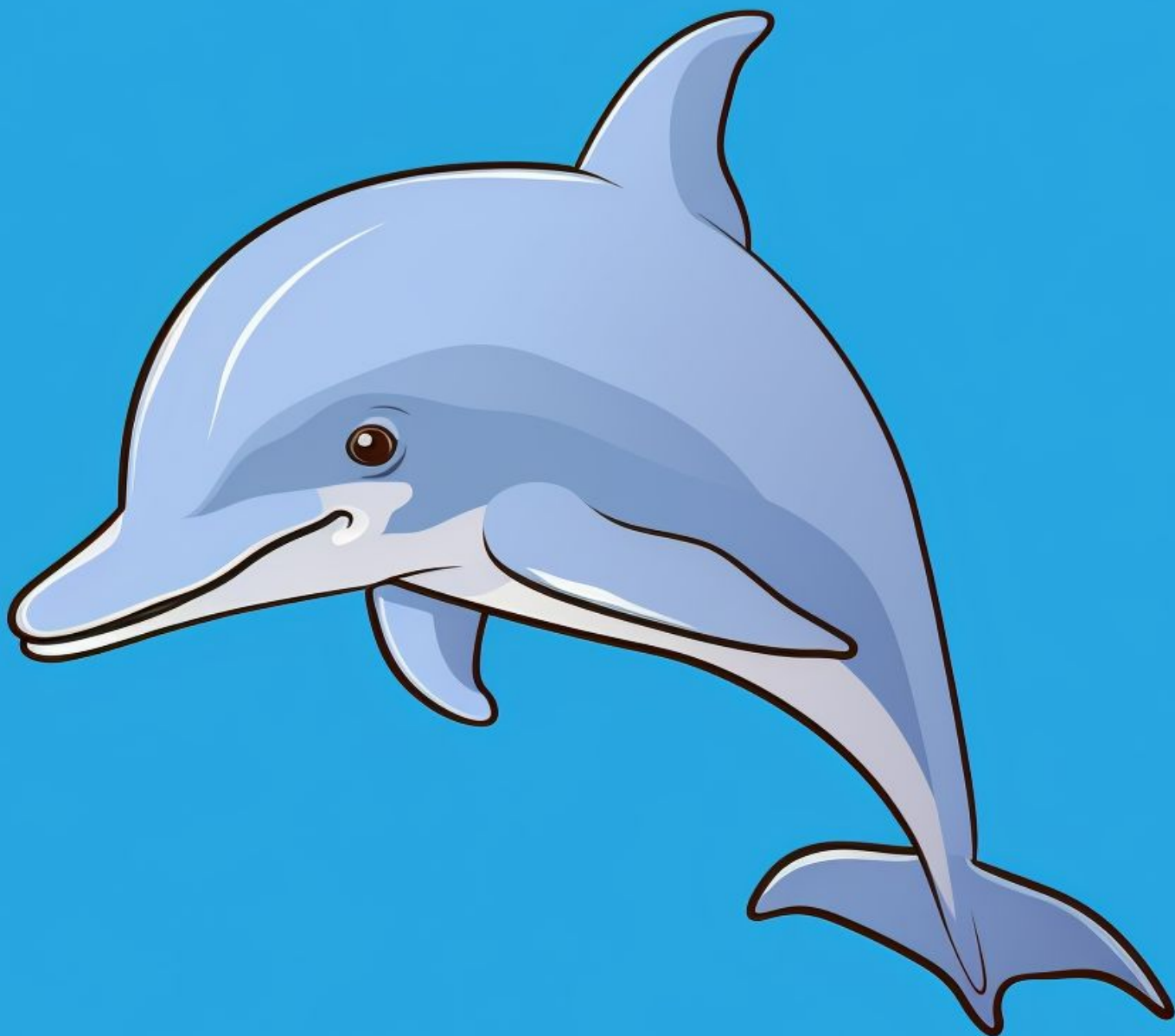


Cc

their dinner.

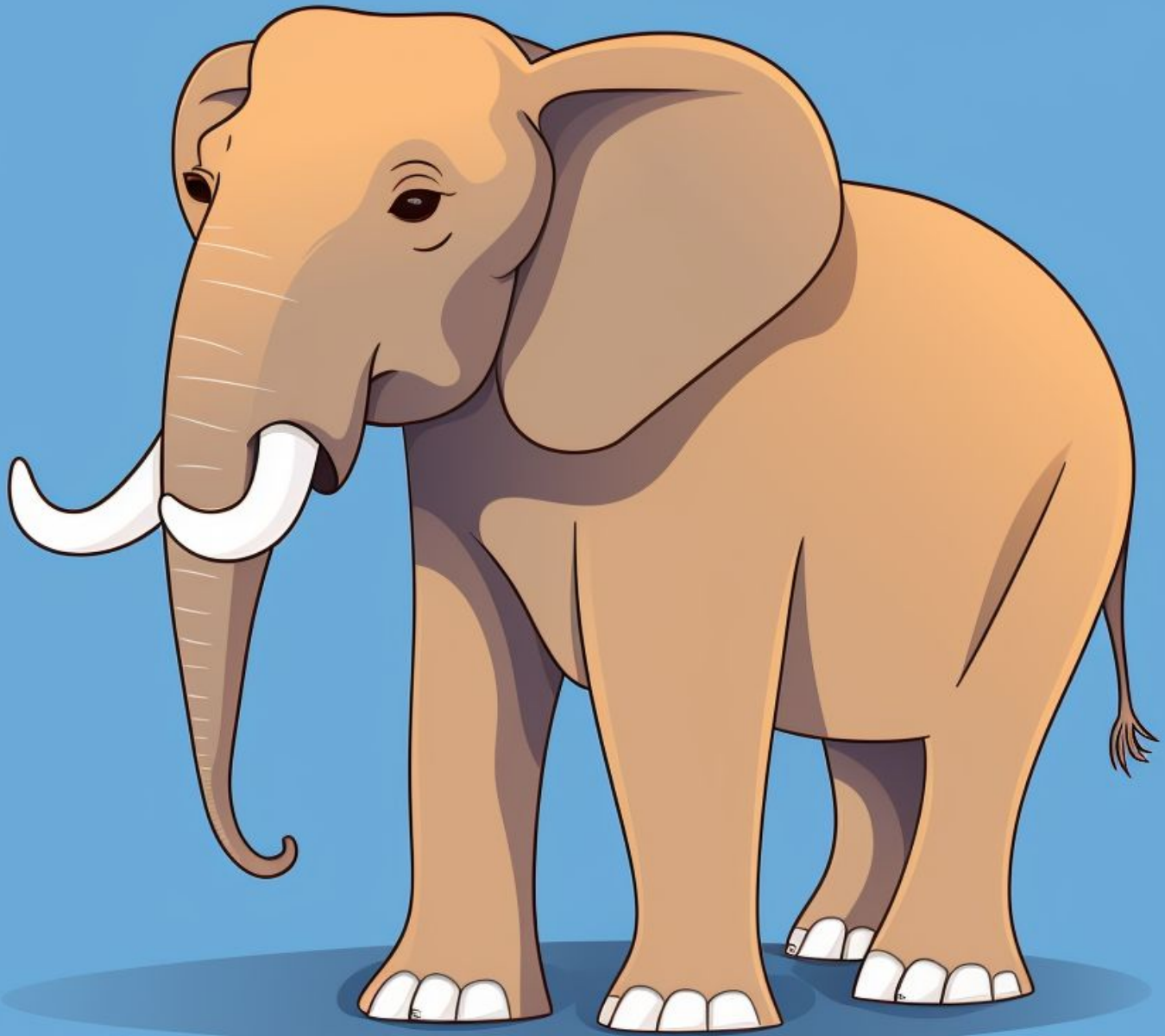


Dd

Flamingos are like fancy pink dancers, standing on one leg at their pink party.

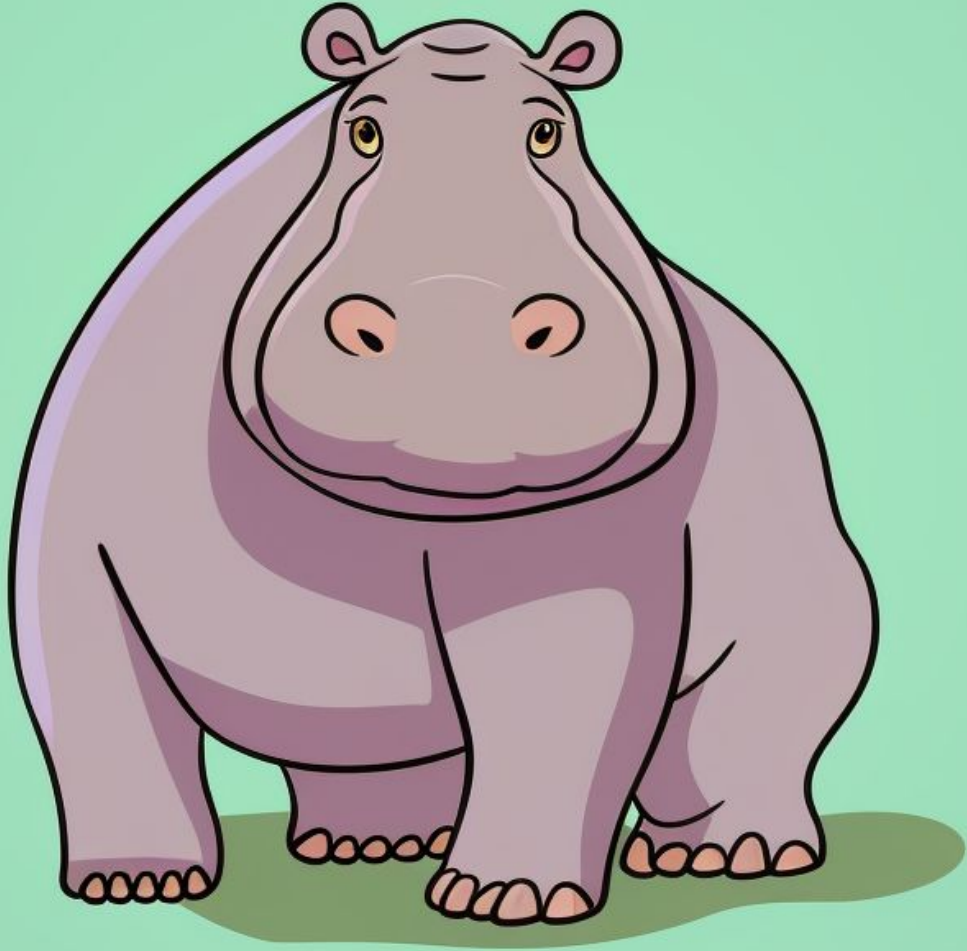


Gg

Lions are like royal cats, with big manes and a roar that can be heard for miles.

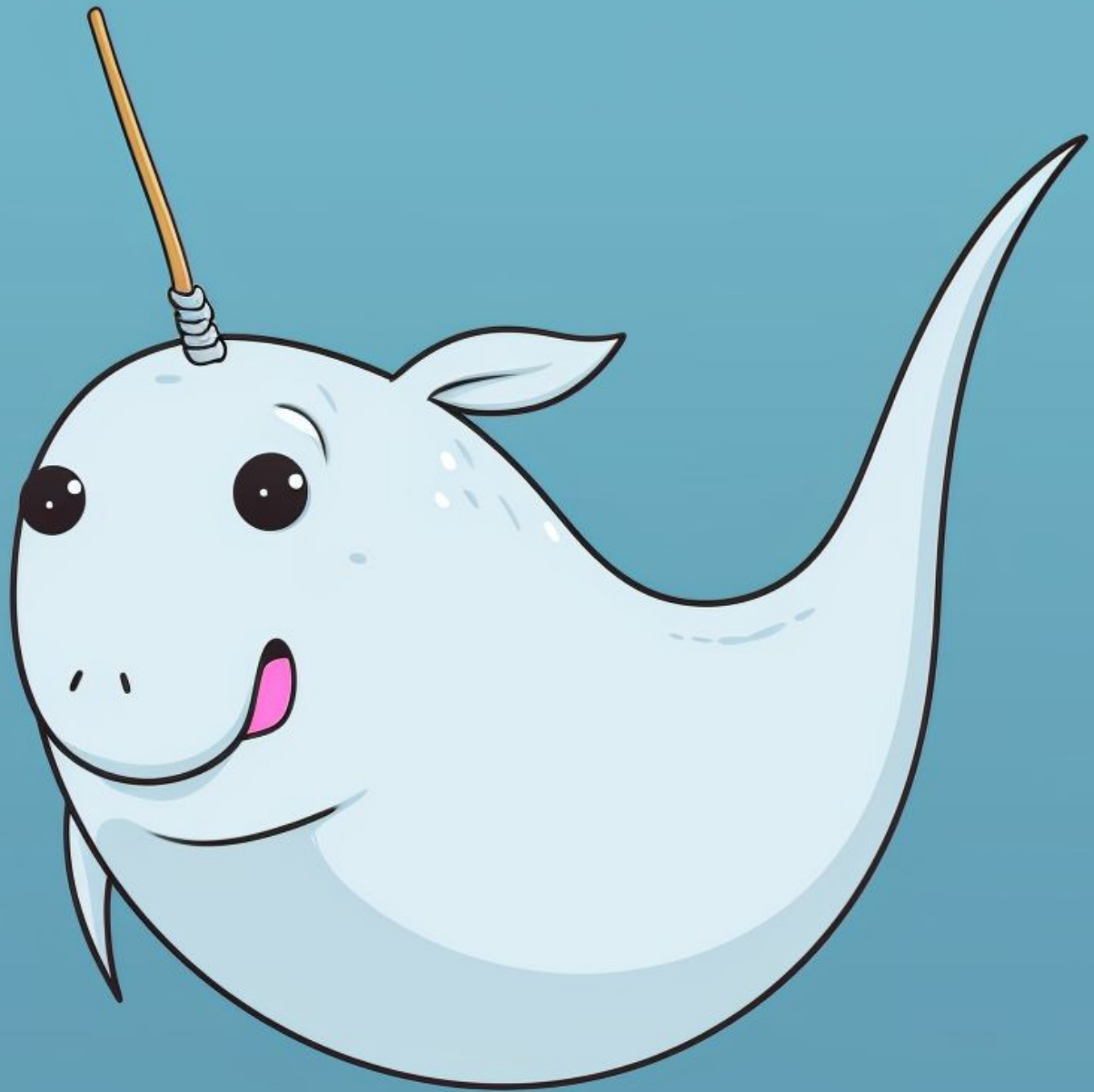


Mm

Moose are like big, goofy forest friends with enormous antlers.

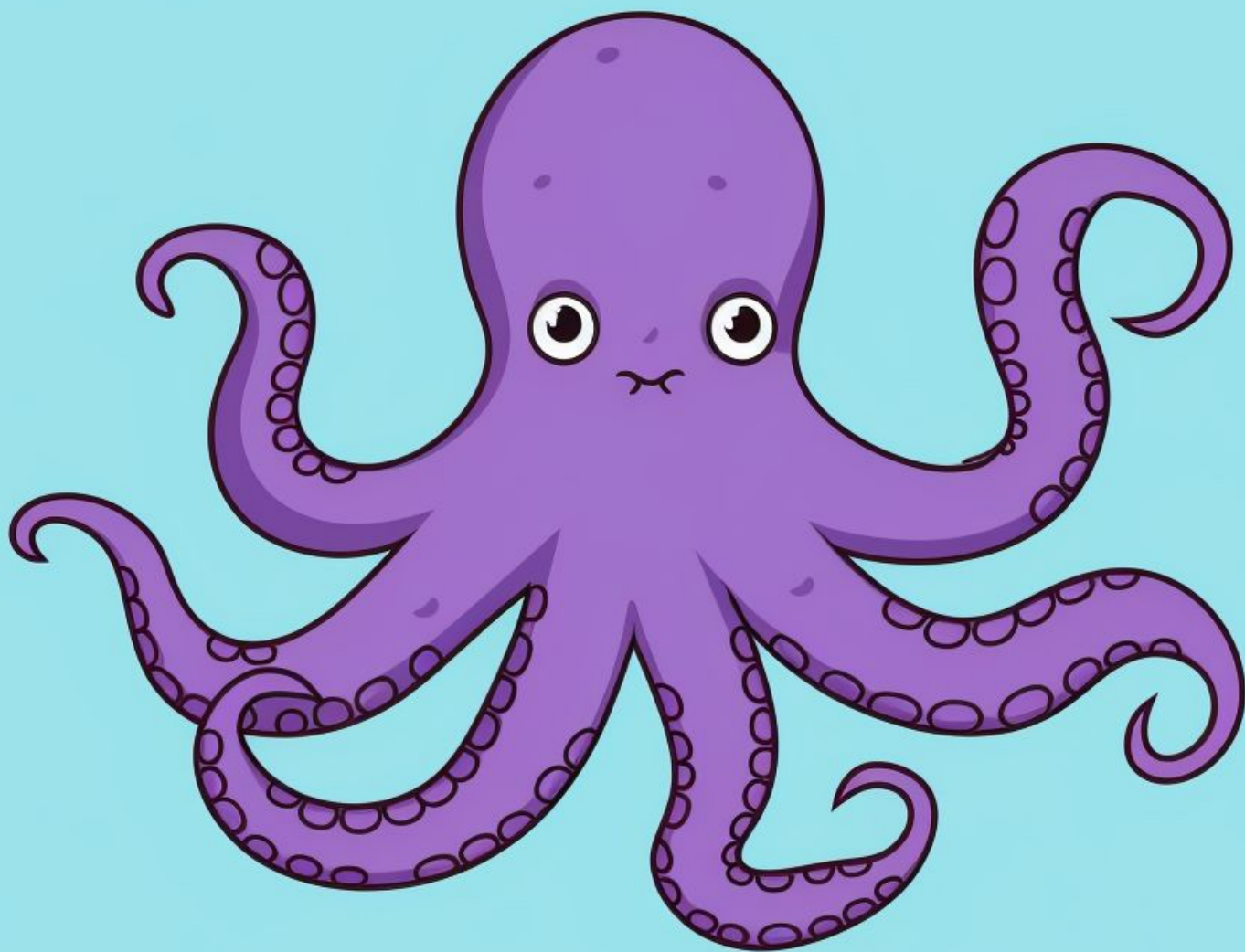


Nn

Tigers are like jungle kings with orange fur and black stripes.

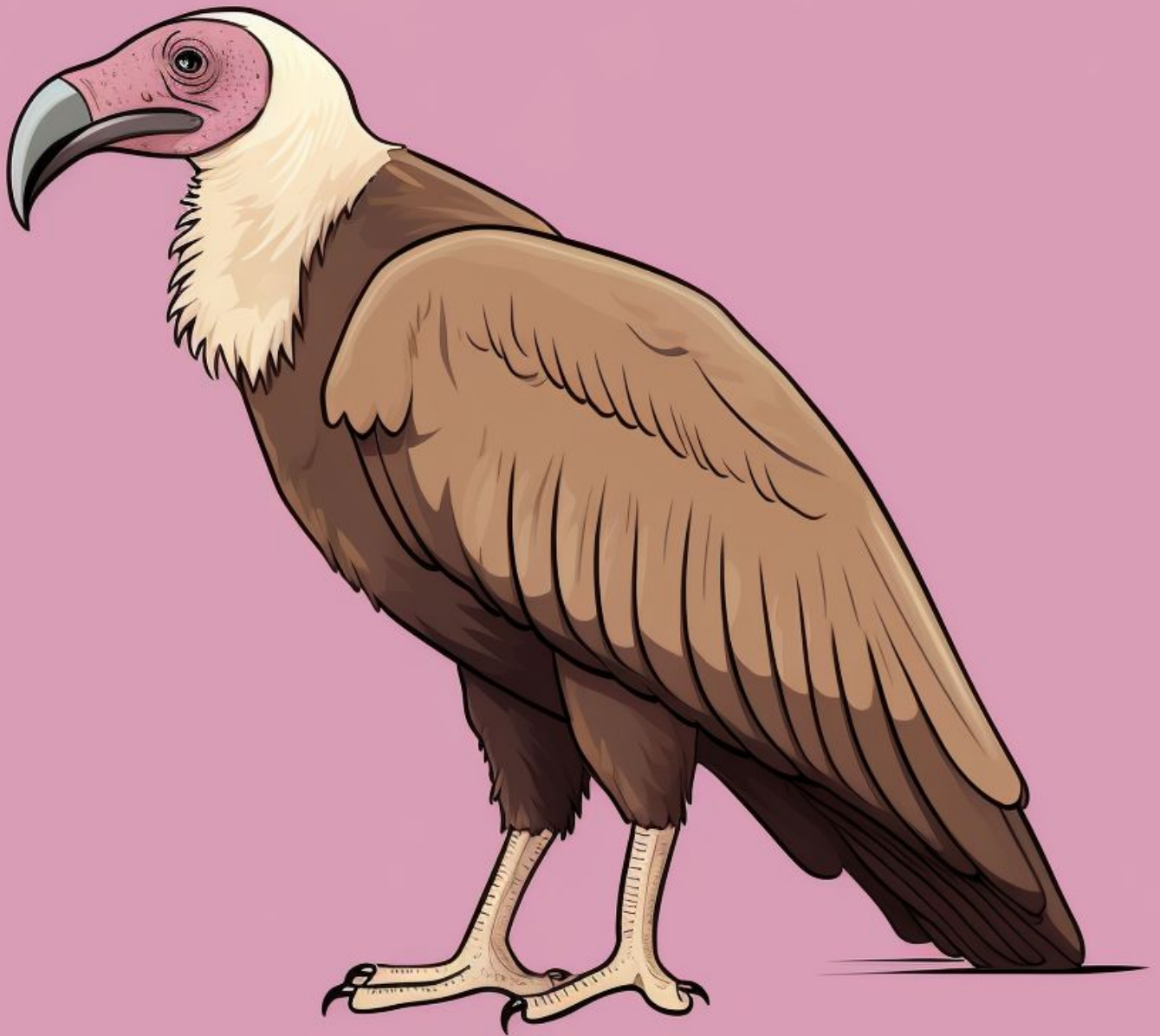


Uu

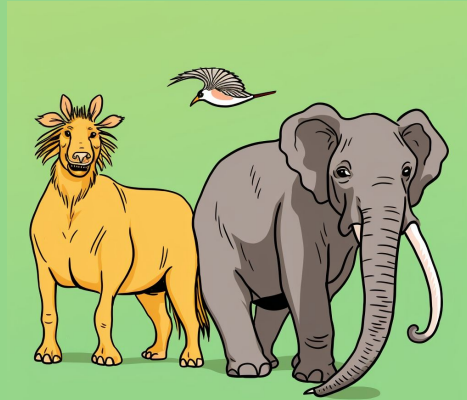
