Captain


The captain is in charge of the boat and its crew, like the leader of a ship.

A ferry is a boat that carries passengers and vehicles across bodies of water.






- is for -Galley

An inboard motor is an engine located inside the boat's hull, used for propulsion.

A Jet Ski is a brand of personal watercraft, often used for recreational purposes.

A kayak is a small, narrow boat that is typically paddled by one or more people.





Lifeboat

A lifeboat is a specially designed boat used for rescuing people from a sinking vessel.





Mast


The mast is a tall, vertical pole on sailboats that supports the sails.






Nautical Chart

is for –Trawler


A trawler is a type of fishing boat used for catching fish and other seafood.

U-boat is a nickname for German submarines used during World War I and World War II.

Vessel

Vessel is a general term for any type of watercraft, from small boats to large ships.

Wake is the trail of disturbed water left behind a boat as it moves through the water.





is for –Xenon Light

Xenon lights are powerful, bright lights used for navigation and signaling on boats.

A yacht is a luxurious and often privately owned boat, often used for recreation and travel.





- is for -Zinc Anode

A zinc anode is a sacrificial metal used on boats to protect against corrosion.
